Saturday, Nov. 9, 12noon: The annual Veterans Day parade in Santa Barbara presented by the PCVF, forming up near the corner of State and Sola by 11:30am with the parade kicking off at 12noon. However, our Huey will be on site by 10:30 in order to accommodate the placement of other military vehicles. We need five flag bearers, plus two folks to handle the 218 Banner. I'll bring the flags and harnesses. See you there!

Saturday, Nov. 9, 12noon to 9pm: The annual Salute to the Vets at the Santa Barbara Carriage and Western Art Museum, 129 Castillo Street, featuring live music, food and military displays.
