We'll have a pop-up tent to sell our Huey T-Shirts and other memorabilia. A PA system will pump out the great songs of the 50s, 60s & 70s. All this at the invitation of Laura Pettit, the owner of Fosters, who was of such great help to us a few years ago when she provided the pulled pork for our Fiesta Booth. She's a huge fan of 218 and Veterans of all eras.

The bird will arrive around 9am and we need a crew of folks to help with the setup of the tent, tables, boxes of shirts, the PA, etc. We do have power available. We'll be able to take MC/Visa, credit & debit, cards and we'll have change on hand for those folks who don't use plastic.

If you can spare a few hours (or longer), come join us to meet and greet the public. It'll be Labor Day Weekend so I expect we'll be seeing lots of folks all day long! It is my wish that we get the Huey, and our members, out before the public at least once a month, or every other month, from Goleta to Carpinteria and rotate our locations. This is the only way to show the public that we haven't "died off" and that our commitment to the community and our fellow Vets is just as strong as ever. Plus, we'll be able to raise much needed funds along the way.

Speaking of the Huey, it's now safely parked in a very out-of-the-way lot in Goleta. And the better news is that we are working with the Santa Barbara School District to get it back to the old NG Armory on Canon Perdido, where it spent quite a few years. Details are being hammered out. We'll keep you posted.

Kristina Duckworth-Bailey, the owner of Thomas Towing, has graciously offered to provide a driver anytime we need to take the bird out for display or to a special event. And it'll be towed by the bright red tow truck she had repainted in memory of Santiago Perez Jr., former co-owner and long time driver, who we lost last year in an industrial accident.

Special thanks to Don Stevens, who had kept the bird on his lot off Hollister in Goleta, at no charge, and was kind enough to drive the bird in the recent parade as well as get it to its new location. Don was faced with the huge task of moving all the heavy equipment (Huey included) on the lot after the new owners of the property ordered him to vacate in less than two weeks.

The bird's next appearance will be at the PEP Touch-A-Truck event at Santa Barbara City College, West Campus Parking Lot, on Sunday, September 22 from 9:30am to 2pm. It's the annual fundraiser for Postpartum Education for Parents and is a family-friendly event. We've been to this one before and we're always swarmed with kids and parents.
